I. The politics of the Church

What causes problems in the church today?

Acts 20:29 ff.; 1 Tim 1:3, 4:1; 6:3

II. The Character of the Christian, Mark 9:33-37, 10:13-16

Who is the greatest, just what were the apostles thinking? Mat 10 ff., John 6:68; Mt 16:13 ff.

Acts 1:6? - Consider Acts 1:3 & 15:16-18

Jesus' reply:

- 1. If anyone would be first, he must be last and servant to all Mk 9:35
- 2. Welcome the child, welcome the king Mk 9:37
- 3. To enter the kingdom, you must do it as a child Mk 10:15
- III. The Role of a Christian, Mark 10:35-45

What is the most important role in the church? Jesus came to serve and give his life.

IV. Why is this so important - the case for unity?

What causes the splits, divisions within the church today? Jesus teaches we must fight against:

First: Favoritism - the idea that some are more important than others

Second: A cynical, judgmental attitude, hypocrisy - hardness of heart

Third: power: The desire for control and power

We must be open, with the soft heart of a child.


