OPPORTUNITY TO MEET NEEDS IN HAITI

For the past few years around this time of the year, we have collected various items to help the people of Haiti. These items consist of dry goods (rice and beans); sheets, pillowcases, and towels; and shoes (we have an available supply of shoes to donate).
