They came to Thessalonica, where there was a Jewish synagogue. As was his custom, Paul went into the synagogue, and on three Sabbath days he reasoned with them from the Scriptures, explaining and proving that the Christ had to suffer and rise from the dead. "This Jesus I am proclaiming to you is the Christ," he said. Some of the Jews were persuaded and joined Paul and Silas, as did a large number of God-fearing Greeks and not a few prominent women. But the Jews were jealous; so they rounded up some bad characters from the marketplace, formed a mob and started a riot in the city. They rushed to Jason's house in search of Paul and Silas in order to bring them out to the crowd. But when they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some other brothers before the city officials, shouting: "These men who have caused trouble all over the world have now come here, and Jason has welcomed them into his house. They are all defying Caesar's decrees, saying that there is another king, one called Jesus." When they heard this, the crowd and the city officials were thrown into turmoil. Acts 17:1—8

The Elders will put forward a final list of Elder candidates to the congregation on Sunday, May 1, 2016, and ask for the congregation to review, pray about, and provide any comments or feedback to the Elders over the following two weeks (ending Sunday, May 15, 2016). After this process is completed, we will need (based on our revised By Laws) a formal congregational meeting (with a quorum established) to approve/install the Elders. Two-thirds of the members present at the congregational meeting must approve each final Elder candidate submitted to the congregation for consideration.
