Selection of Additional Elders

We will be having a formal congregational meeting on Sunday, June 26, 2016. The meeting will be held directly after our Sunday morning worship service, and will be held to about 30 minutes. For this to be an official meeting (based on our By Laws) meeting we need to have a majority of the congregation present (with a quorum established) – so please plan on attending if at all possible.

Agenda:

• Approval of Additional Elders – this involves approval of each final Elder candidate (Jim Conn, Bruce Pierce, David Woodford) previously submitted by the Elders for congregational consideration.

• Decision to Pursue Hiring an Associate Minister – this approves the congregation moving forward with searching for, interviewing, and hiring an Associate Minister. There have been several discussions at various Focus Group Meetings on this topic, including purpose, qualifications, salary, congregational budget implications, and a job posting.
