

#### CHRISTMAS SHOEBOXES FOR HONDURAN CHILDREN

You may use your own boxes or pick up boxes in the fellowship hall. Book bags, backpacks, and large handbags may also be used. Tool boxes with basic hand tools and treats are great for the older teen boys. Label the box with the age and sex of the child it is intended for. **Please do not wrap anything in the box, or the box itself**. The boxes will be wrapped before they are shipped.

Please place anything edible in ziplock bags. It's recommended that you place several one gallon or larger ziplock bags in each box. These are great to store and carry items.

<u>Please do not put the following items in your boxes:</u> Any military-type items, books that are predominately English, candies that could melt, used items, candles, aerosol cans, knives, items that would need electricity or batteries to run.

Here are a few suggestions for filling your boxes (think Dollar Tree, Wal-Mart, etc.):
